Registration:

Registration must be made by the respective national federation to the IFI office by **06.07.2026 at the latest**.

Logout:

Deregistration's from the Champions League are possible until **21.08.2026**. Deregistration after **21.08.2026** will result in a fine of €500.00.

Champions League Draw

All teams will be drawn from a lottery pot. Four balls are drawn one after the other, with the first four balls drawn forming Group **A**. The next four balls drawn are Group **B** and the remaining four balls are Group **C**.

Champions League Implementation

The International Icestock Rules (**IER**) 2022 and International Rules of the Game (**ISpO**) 2022 in conjunction with the IFI Implementing Regulations for Elite Sports (as of 18.02.2025) must be complied with.

Attention: According to the IFI Congress resolution of 03.03.2025, the purple outsole is not permitted in the Women's Champions League.



The sports equipment parts used must be checked by a preliminary inspection in accordance with the IFI implementation regulations (point 1.7). A test report must be drawn up for this. The listed sports equipment parts are provided with their own marking / sticker. Inspection stickers from the IFI are not provided. A maximum of 40 summer outsoles, 10 handles and 5 stick bodies may be marked and recorded. For this purpose, the attached IFI test protocol "CL 2026" must be used and submitted at the time of registration. Inspections of sports equipment in accordance with (ISpO §417). If a sports equipment part does not meet the test criteria, it is withdrawn without replacement. Penalties within the group stage in accordance with (IER Rule 803b or 805a) – in the finals (best of three) the match is lost. The teams have the opportunity to have their sports equipment parts tested on site on a voluntary basis. These are marked and recorded and sealed by the test referees, i.e. these sports equipment parts are only available to the teams during the competition - i.e. in the individual rounds - and must be handed in afterwards. A maximum of 10 summer outsoles, 2 handles and 1 stick body may be presented for this purpose. These sports equipment parts are excluded from the above-mentioned preliminary inspection but will be confiscated without replacement if the test criteria are not met.

Note:

The teams must use 4 floor bodies of the same manufacturer. If a team cannot meet these requirements, it can apply to the IFI for a request for the loan of the poles.

Group matches

Game Mode:

Three groups (A, B, C) of 4 teams each.

"Everyone against everyone" in the group. The group matches will be played in a first and second round. The first-placed and second-placed teams in each group and the two best third-placed teams advance/advance to the 1/4 final.
